Come and enjoy the natural beauty the Lord has given us. Hunt whitetail deer and fellowship with other outdoorsmen who have the same love of archery and hunting.

Non-hunting spouses and families welcome.

This will be our 13th year.

HUNT TIME:

Hunters may begin arriving the evening of Friday, the 28th. Registration begins at 7:00 p.m. The first meal will be Saturday breakfast. If you are coming in on Friday we would suggest you eat before you come or you can join with others who travel back into Chillicothe for their evening meal. Our first speaker will be on Saturday evening. **THE HUNT WILL END SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8th**, with the final meal being breakfast. Day rates are available for those who cannot hunt for the entire week, so come as your schedule will allow.

COST:

WEEK RATE: Food and lodging for the week is \$225.00 per person (16 yrs & up). Youth (6yrs – 15yrs) will cost \$120.00. Children 5 yrs old and under are free. Please call for special pricing should you be a family with 2 or more children. After September 30th, day rates will apply.

DAY RATE: Day rate will be \$50.00 per person per day (adult) and \$25.00 per day for youth. **NOTE: While there is no additional charge for “walk-ins”, pre-registration, if possible, would be greatly appreciated. If you are not spending the night, we ask only for a donation towards any meals you may participate in.**

KITCHEN DUTY:

To keep the hunt affordable for all, we ask that everyone perform chore duty. This can cover anything from doing dishes to sweeping floors. If you come for the whole week, we ask that you serve the equivalent of one day. If you are only coming for a few days, we ask for a meal or two. Should this not appeal to you, you can “buy-out” your chore duty for an additional \$50.00. Please note it on your registration form. ****Those serving kitchen duty will have their names put in a drawing for a special prize to be determined.**** In the past it has been a bow.

LICENSE AND HUNTING:

Out of state licenses may be obtained by contacting the Division of Wildlife, License Section, 1840 Belcher Drive, Columbus, Ohio 43224-1329. Phone: (614) 265-7040. Licenses are valid March 1, 2008 through February 28, 2009 and can be purchased on line. For more information go to www.dnr.state.oh.us/wildlife.

FOREST DESCRIPTION:

Tar Hollow State Forest and Park’s combined 16,110 acres offer a great variety of plants and wildlife. White and Red Oak dominate this hill covered woodland. The forest varies from areas that have been clear-cut, selectively cut, mature forest growth and selective pine planting. The last week in October should see the Tar Hollow plant life in full swing toward its autumn beauty. Hunting, fishing and hiking will be inspiring and breathtaking.

LAW:

Each hunter is responsible to follow all hunting and fishing regulations. Plants and trees are protected and are not to be damaged. Portable tree stands may be used, **BUT NO SCREW-IN STEPS ARE PERMITTED**. We would ask that you familiarize yourself with the laws and the rules of the park in order that our relationship with the park officials remains unblemished. State park regulations require hunters to be four hundred feet from roads, trails and buildings before you begin hunting.

PHYSICAL CONDITIONING:

There are many places close to camp for easy hunting. Tar Hollow also has some rugged areas. A wounded deer may put you to work. Dragging a big buck up and down the hills is tough. Please be physically ready. Please bring any health problems to our attention. People with allergies to bee stings should have emergency bee sting treatment kits, as we are at least ½ hour from the nearest hospital. Be aware of your surroundings. A whistle, compass and a map will help you to avoid getting lost. If you cannot read a topographical map, please ask for assistance.

We provide a large topographical map on which we keep track of the hunters. Upon your arrival you are assigned a “hunter number”.

You will be required to put your number on this map. This serves two purposes. First, everyone can see where each other is and avoid hunting too close to each other and second, it lets us know where to look should an unfortunate situation arise. This is for your own protection.

FISHING:

Pine Lake, which is at the base of Tar Hollow Lodge, is stocked with large mouth bass, bluegill, crappie and catfish. The lodge has canoes and jon boats for your use at no extra cost. Fishing licenses for out of state residents are \$40.00. The cost of a 3-day license is \$19.00. These licenses should be purchased ahead of time if you plan to fish.

GAME CARE & SUPPLIES:

Tar Hollow Lodge has a screened in porch area where deer can be hung to cool and can be butchered. The packed meat can be frozen in one of the lodge freezers. **NO UNTAGGED DEER WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE PREMISES**. All rules of the game room must be followed. All deer must be registered by the game room coordinator and picture taken prior to butchering. **PLEASE BE COGNIZANT OF THE TEMPERATURE & HOW LONG YOU LEAVE YOUR DEER HANG PRIOR TO BUTCHERING**. **LOTHAC** will not be responsible for tainted meat. Please attend to your deer promptly and clean up your mess. Others may be waiting to do their deer. Dispose of waste properly. Butchering services are available locally.

LODGING:

Each cabin has 8 bunks. We suggest no more than 5 hunters per cabin so as to allow plenty of room for your gear. Cabins are ***NOT*** heated and you are responsible for your own heat source (kerosene or propane - **NO ELECTRIC HEATERS PERMITTED**). Please bring your own bedding and linens. We suggest an old throw rug for the floor and a (14’ x 18’) tarp to stretch across the cabin’s rafters. This will help keep the heat down where you are. We provide plastic that can be stapled to the walls of the cabin should it be unusually cold. You **MUST** remove it at the end of the week. There is a restroom/shower house for each group of eight cabins. A lawn chair for sitting around the lodge fireplace will also be appreciated. ****Campers and Trailers are welcome, however, there are only a few electric hook-ups and they will be available based on size and first registered basis.** Fly-in hunters will be bunked with hunters who have heat. The roads to the cabins are narrow service roads so a 4-wheel drive vehicle is best.

MEALS:

Three meals a day are served, cafeteria style, over a 1 ½ to 2-hour period. This allows more flexibility for the hunters to plan their comings and goings into the woods. Provisions are available for those who wish to pack a lunch to take into the woods with them. An ice machine is available in the lodge. Should you have special dietary needs, you must let us know in advance. *Please note that beer and alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the State Park or on forest property.*

CAMP CLEAN-UP:

The Tar Hollow Lodge, the kitchen, gameroom and all the facility have to be thoroughly cleaned prior to our leaving. Please help us throughout the week by picking up any and all trash, reporting any damage and returning all dishes to the kitchen to be accounted for.

TOURISM, SIGHT-SEEING & FAMILY ACTIVITIES:

For those who have non-hunting spouses and families, sightseeing and shopping are both within an easy one-hour drive of the Tar Hollow Lodge. You are free to plan activities on your own or participate in ones we have planned. At least two field trips will be planned out of the park. There could be more, based on interest. Activities within the park will also be planned; again the number will be based on interest. Crafts will also be available. Some of these activities will incur additional, though small, cost. Please note your interest in knowing more specific information regarding these activities and we will send you that information when it becomes available.

REGISTRATION:

Registrations are being accepted now. 50% deposit is due with your registration. Each registration, paid in full, and received prior to September 5th will be entered into a drawing for a free 2009 Trophies of Grace Whitetail Deer Hunt. Please make checks payable to “LOTHAC” or “Lord of the Harvest Archery Club”.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Coin-operated laundry facility is available in the campground. A washer and dryer are available at the lodge for your use (at no charge) when not in use by the kitchen staff.
- No pets are permitted.
- No paintball
- No firearms are permitted to be discharged within the state park.
